#### **Meeting Notes**



#### **CLUB MEETING**

Wednesday 1st February 2017 at Mindarie Marina Boardroom

The meeting commenced at 1804 and was well attended. President Sandy extended a welcome to all members and guests for the first Club meeting of the year.

Apologies had been received from PP Darren, Brian, Peter, Tracey, Nick and PP Karina. Margaret was a late apology.

In addition, we welcomed our guests – Mia Taylor, Mark and Andrea Folkhard, Tiffany Dowling.as well as Olga Burlikowska our incoming RYE student

The toast was given by Tiffany.

As regards makeups, Ralph mentioned:

- Attendance at a meeting regarding the RC West Perth medical equipment recycling committee as we had used some of their equipment for Ampan
- Involvement in the District Public Image and Marketing Committee.
- Kelly mentioned her involvement with AJYCE planning for the incoming Japanese students

President Sandy then spoke about our projects and activities:

- The success of the Christmas hamper event
- Our meeting venue
- Swap Mart's importance to the Club and that a special Board meeting will occur tomorrow to discuss the future in the light of possible extended Sunday trading after the election
- Members were referred to the calendar of events on the website which included RC Wanneroo and RC Joondalup events as well as some other District Club events
- Sells family break and current plans for additional action.
   Dave advised that he will visit the family on Saturday to do some further assessment of the extent of paving required since the extension to the house had been commenced.

#### Cheryl advised:

- Outgoing RYE student Perri had departed and was now ensconced in Finland
- After 6 months with RC Broome, Olga is with us and is currently with Tracey and then will be with Perri's parents and PP Nigel.
- Harry Harrop, our selected 4 Way Test entrant will be in the semi final to be held on 27<sup>th</sup> February at Woodvale Tavern and that all members should come and cheer him on.

Olga spoke briefly about her experience in Broome and we look forward to hearing from he "formally" at the next meeting.

As Margaret was a late apology, Ralph informed those present of Margaret's comments about the arrival of the container in Kiaipit and advised that Margaret will give us a more detailed presentation in the future.

There was discussion about the ongoing sustainability of the Ampan effort and particularly the exchange of expertise. Ralph mentioned that Mindarie PS are considering sponsoring an Ampan teacher for a brief period.

PP Sally was called upon to provide an overview of the proposed RCM Signature Project:

- RCM needed a project which involved all Club members and delivered outcome at regular intervals
- Focus needed to be on the local community i.e. the homeless, needy, disadvantaged, youth etc
- The project needed to be simple and straightforward and not something that grew too large and complex
- Essentially started as a Christmas/Winter Appeal involving a delivery of hampers or such – depending on the season
- However, now envisaged as delivery of say 25 hampers every quarter and the effort themed according to the season/time of the year
- In addition, it is proposed that at the end of the year, RCM puts on an afternoon tea for the elderly and homeless and makes arrangements to host this event in a location and transport people to and from the event.
- It is felt that this would have CoW support and could involve harnessing local businesses and other groups.
- It was felt that the current Areas of Service structure did not lend itself to this style of project but could be the coordination points.
- All Club members would have nominated responsibilities
  e.g. collection and storage of items, transportation,
  administration, publicity. These could be rotated at
  intervals.

There was discussion about integration with other activities such as RYPEN and that we needed to meet to specifically flesh out this concept further and allocate responsibilities. Mia asked if RCM collaborates with other groups as she was aware of a group that could use manpower assistance for their events/activities. The response was that RCM wis willing to work with other community groups.

#### Mike advised:

- He has heard from Tamala Park Regional Council who wish to progress the Rotary Park concept further
- Port School is willing to be involved in the Christmas Sleigh concept.
- We did not proceed with CoW Butler Bonanza as the parameters for our involvement were somewhat unclear. A new Director of Community Services has now been retained by CoW.

Ralph gave a quick summary of District events for February, March and April and mentioned that District Conference on the 24/25<sup>th</sup> March at Guilford Grammar School. Sandy recommended that Members should make an effort to attend as the speakers at last year's conference were inspirational.

SaA Brian advised that there would be no fines this meeting but that there would be a doubling at the next meeting

The meeting closed at 1913.

#### DID YOU KNOW?

RCM is registered as a *non-for-profit* organisation, under the *Associations Incorporation Act 1987*, as a legal entity.

Where we differ from sporting clubs and social clubs is that we operate under the *Charitable Collections Act* 1946 and we are required by law to adhere to strict guidelines and provide the WA Department of Commerce (WADoC) with an annual report on our charitable disbursements.

A Board of Directors for RCM is mandated by the By-Laws and Constitution of the Club and the *Al Act* and is required by legislation to have, as its governing body at least eight (8) officers elected by members (President, Secretary, Treasurer, President Elect or Nominee and at least four (4) Directors as well as the immediate Past President.

Of the above, the President, Secretary and Treasurer are required to be registered with the WADoC as the key Office Bearers of RCM and are legally accountable for the management and disbursement of funds by RCM.

Consequently, the above key Office Bearers have:

- Authority to access the Administration and Charitable bank accounts of RCM,
- Discretionary spending authority on the Administration account, and
- Subject to Board approval, disbursement authority on the Charitable account.

In addition, only these Officers are authorised to commit the Club to any agreement/contract (written or verbal) which commits funds or Club resources i.e. sign agreement/contracts.

# PERSONAL DONALION Rotary Foundation

The Centurion Club is a way for Rotarians and Friends of Rotary to make a small regular personal contribution to the Rotary Foundation. These donations are tax-deductible.




Rotarians are also expected to participate actively in their Club's projects.



#### BYLAWS OF THE



#### ROTARY CLUB OF MINDARIE

The By Laws for our Club provide a set of guidelines for managing the Club.

The RI recommended Rotary Club Bylaws are developed in harmony with the Standard RI Rotary Club Constitution and reflect current Rotary policy.

They can be adapted to meet our Club's needs, goals, and activities and reflect its unique identity.

Over time, as our Club's leadership plan evolves, we need to revisit our bylaws and revise them to reflect new practices and procedures.

We can amend the bylaws at any regular meeting where a majority of the Club's members are present.

Any proposed amendments should first be approved by the Club's Board, and all members should be notified of proposed amendments at least 10 days before the vote.

Amendments to the bylaws must be approved by a two-thirds majority vote of members.

The RCM Constitution and By Laws can be read on the RCM website.

#### HONORARY MEMBERSHIP

Honorary" is one of the four types of membership a person may have in a Rotary club. This type of membership is the highest distinction a Rotary club can confer and is exercised only in exceptional cases to recognize an individual for unusual service and contributions to Rotary and society. An honorary member is elected for one year only, and continuing membership must be renewed annually. Honorary members cannot propose new members to the club, do not hold office and are exempt from attendance requirements and club dues. Many distinguished heads of state, explorers, authors, musicians, astronauts and other public personalities have been honorary members of Rotary clubs, including King Gustaf of Sweden, King George VI of England, King Badouin of Belgium, King Hassan III of Morocco, Sir Winston Churchill, humanitarian Albert Schweitzer, Charles Lindberg, composer Jean Sibelius, explorer Sir Edmund Hillary, Thor Heyerdahl, Thomas Edison, Walt Disney, Bob Hope, Dr. Albert Sabin, British Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher and many of the presidents of the United States. Truly, those selected for honorary membership are those who have done much to further the ideals of Rotary.
